

OUTLINE OF A DISCIPLESHIP APPOINTMENT

S.H.A.R.P.E.N.

SEE HOW THEY'RE DOING (5 MINUTES)

- * Ask questions to find out how they are doing physically, emotionally and spiritually

HONEST ACCOUNTABILITY (5-10 MINUTES)

- * Are you getting unhurried time with God?
- * What has God been teaching you in the Word?
- * Scripture Memory (if applicable)
- * Purity questions (if applicable)
- * Establish other areas in which they would want accountability
- * How are these going? Anything to confess? Is your conscience clear? Any changes to make? How can I help?

ACTIVITY IN MINISTRY (15 MINUTES)

- * Work through their Ministry Cake sheet — sowing/evangelism/establishing list
- * How did they do on last week's goal?
- * Set new goals for this week.

READ & DISCUSS WORD (20 MINUTES)

- * Work through your prepared one to one (next page)
- * Get into the Word together and discuss it
- * Lead with Questions & Relate with Stories
- * Always stick to and follow the objective you want to accomplish

PRAY (5-10 MINUTES)

- * Pray about pressing things they might have mentioned
- * Pray for the people they are sharing the gospel with and ministry goals
- * Pray through the objectives and points of your one to one

AFTER THE 1-1:

EVALUATE

- * After the 1-1...evaluate how they are doing. Think through next steps for next time.

NOTES

- * Take notes on how everything went and key things to remember.
- * Update your Discipleship log

Brainstorm Sample Scriptures:

A. KICKOFF question(s): (prep this last. This peaks interest)

B. HEAD (What?) – knowledge of topic, understand the principle

- Intro the topic. “We’re looking at _____ today. Let’s look at some verses that deal with that.”
- Look at either a passage or sample of passages related to that topic.
- Ask some observation questions related to your topic.

C. HEART (Why?) – root the topic deep in them/build conviction for it

- Why is this topic significant? In life? In ministry?
- Brainstorm 3-4 interpretation or conviction questions to help build conviction for this topic.
- Share examples in your own life

D. HANDS (How?) – ability to do it

- Connect to “life”
- Ask application questions that help them flesh out this topic in their life.
- Come up with something to do with them or for them to do on their own
- Have some sort of follow up to check in with them on their application.
